If you're nodding your head yes, you're definitely not alone—these things affect most dogs at some point in their life and dogs with sensitive stomachs may have frequent symptoms.


To help your dog feel better, a natural digestive supplement (something you can keep in your pantry for “surprise” upset stomach incidents) might be just what they need!

How Can You Help a Dog with Digestive Distress

Digestive issues—such as nausea, indigestion, diarrhea, or constipation—are some of the most common conditions leading to veterinary visits.

There are many reasons why a dog might have an upset stomach, including:

- They ate something that didn't agree with them (such as overindulging in people food, or eating something off the ground during a walk)
- A sensitive stomach, food allergy, or inflammatory bowel condition
- Other medical conditions
- Parasites or infections
- Taking antibiotics or other medications
- Stress



Symptoms can be mild, moderate, or severe in nature. Sometimes the symptoms pass quickly on their own, while other times your pup may feel down for a few days. When in doubt, it's best to err on the side of caution and check with your veterinarian.

Determining the Cause of the Stomach Upset

If your pup suffers from digestive symptoms, it's important to figure out if there's an underlying cause that could be treated or managed—such as a food allergy or parasite infestation. Your veterinarian will let you know the most likely causes based on your pet's history, symptoms, and physical exam, and then recommend any needed diagnostic tests.

Of course, if your pet is severely ill, treatments will be implemented at your visit—possibly including medications for upset stomach, and fluid and electrolyte support. If, however, your dog is otherwise healthy but has occasional bouts of stomach

issues, your veterinarian may recommend some measures you can take at home to help them feel better, such as a bland diet. One possible home care solution for your pup could be nutritional supplementation with Fromm Family Nutritionals.

During times of digestive distress, you can replace up to 80% of your dog's regular food with Nutritionals in the



short-term. Gradually reduce this amount after 2-3 days.

If Fromm Family Nutritionals helps your dog and you'd like to use this digestive aid long-term, simply replace up to 20% of your dog's daily food ration with one of the two Nutritionals recipes.

Note: If your dog has food allergies or is on a prescription diet, it's best to check with your veterinarian prior to feeding anything new.

Other Ways to Support Digestive Health in Your Dog

As they say, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. Here are a few preventive measures you can take to help your dog's gut stay healthy and balanced long-term:

- Feed your dog a complete and balanced diet
- Offer treats in moderation (less than 10% of your dog's daily calorie intake)
- If treats include people food or table scraps, only use bland or veterinarian-approved options. Be sure everyone in the home knows this rule
- During walks outside, prevent your dog from eating things they shouldn't including garbage, food spills, and rabbit droppings
- Plan ahead during times of stress or travel, and have Nutritionals or another digestive support aid on hand
- If your dog takes medications, give the pill with food (unless the instructions indicate otherwise)
